- Get to the slopes quickly for only \$3.00 or \$1.50 for students (with valid student ID)
- Skis and snowboards are either safely stored in a specially designed ski storage bag located inside each bus or can be held by passengers in their seats if a ski bag isn't available
- BATA assumes no liability for injuries or damages incurred to equipment
- First come, first served (make sure that you arrive early)
- Passengers are responsible for loading skis or snowboards; drivers will assist

- As part of the program, students can bring their gear to school and stow it in a designated area.
  They then retrieve their gear just prior to leaving for the resort. No extra driving to pick up gear.

- Various route stops include: Hall St. Transfer Station, Traverse City West Middle School, and Interlochen Center for the Arts

Crystal Mountain features 50 downhill slopes for skiing and riding, group and private ski and snowboard lessons for kids and adults, over 30km of multi-use trail for cross-country skiing, snowshoeing and fat tire biking, dining, shopping, and the award-winning Crystal Spa.

Present your BATA Pass or receipt at the Crystal Mountain Lift Ticket Window and your round trip fee will be deducted from the ticket price. Season Pass holders and those purchasing lift tickets in advance will receive a food and beverage voucher, valid at any of Crystal Mountain's restaurants (cannot be used toward alcoholic beverages), equal to the cost of your round-trip fare.

- Saturday and Sunday drop-offs at The Homestead: 10:16 a.m., 2:16 p.m., and 6:16 p.m.
- Saturday and Sunday pick-ups from The Homestead: 10:34 a.m., 2:34 p.m., and 6:34 p.m.

Various route stops include: Hall St. Transfer Station, Glen Lake High School\*, and M-72 Park and Ride – Maple City

**NOTE**: Riders can request to be dropped off directly at The Homestead Village near the slopes by asking for a stop deviation when boarding the bus or by calling BATA Dispatch at 231.941.2324.

\*Glen Lake High School (GLHS) pick up is scheduled for Fridays only at 4:03 p.m. at GLHS and drop offs at The Homestead are scheduled for 4:16 p.m.

With surface lifts, chair lifts, 15 unique runs, a terrain park, and miles of snowshoe and cross-country ski trails, outdoor enthusiasts will find something to love about The Homestead.

Show your BATA Pass or receipt for food deals at two Homestead locations. Get a ham and cheese or turkey bacon sandwich, chips or cookie, and pop or water for \$5 at Cavanaugh's Deli & General Store or a 20% off meal voucher (not including alcohol, tax, and gratuity) at Beppi's.

Mt. Holiday offers lessons, rentals, terrain parks, aerial lifts, surface lifts, snow tubing, 12 beginner-to-intermediate runs, two new glade runs, and a zipline. If you're looking to take your ski and snowboard skills to the next level, try the Flight School and Freestyle Fridays at the Mt. Holiday Terrain Park.

Receive a discounted lift ticket by presenting your BATA pass or receipt at Guest Services. Students riding BATA can purchase a discounted annual ski pass or get a special student rate on lift tickets and rentals Tuesday – Thursday by showing their BATA Pass or receipt at Guest Services.

# Route 32: Hickory Hills and Mt. Holiday Schedule (Friday only)

- Pick-ups at Cass Rd. Transfer Station: 2:35 p.m., Traverse City East Middle School: 2:50 p.m., St. Elizabeth Ann Seton: 2:55 p.m., Traverse City West Middle School: 3:15 p.m.
- Drop off at Hickory Hills: 3:30 p.m., Mt. Holiday: 3:55 p.m., Timber Ridge: 4:05 p.m.

Hickory Hills is situated on approximately 125 acres and features eight runs: one beginner, five intermediate, and two advanced runs that are serviced by five rope tows. Night skiing is available on seven of the runs. Hickory Hills also offers rental equipment for both skiing and snowboarding. Cross-country skiers can enjoy 3k of trails with a 1k trail lighted for night skiing. The charming lodge, featuring a cozy fireplace and snack bar, was constructed in the 1950s is still used today.

The onsite Ski Patrol promotes safe skiing as well as offers first aid services.
