BATA will also be serving its annual free breakfast at their Hall Street Transfer Station from 7:00 to 9:00 a.m. on June 5. Breakfast will feature food from the Roaming Harvest food truck as well as coffee. Public is welcome.

"The response to our new Loop and Link system has been very positive," said Carrie Thompson, BATA Business Development Director. "On *Try Transit Day,* we want people to experience the expanded convenience our buses now provide, and to consider the bus for their daily commute.

"People in the Grand Traverse area drive nearly twice as much as the national average. Taking the bus is a great way for them to cut commuting costs, reduce stress, and lighten their carbon footprint."

BATA is a long-time participant in *Smart Commute Week*, an annual event organized by Traverse Area Recreation and Transportation (TART) Trails. The purpose of the week is threefold: to encouraging new smart commuters, to gather and celebrate the community's veteran smart commuters, and to highlight new infrastructure improvements that provide safe, connected, and accessible transportation opportunities.
